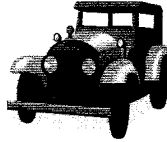

**EVOLUTION COULD NOT DO THIS**  
 Daniel Bernoullie was an 18<sup>th</sup> century  
 physicist who first stated the principle that  
 the pressure exerted by moving fluid  
 decreased as the fluid moves faster.  
 Bernoullie's principle may sound  
 complicated to you and me; but prairie  
 dogs, which live in the Western plains of  
 America, understand it well. These little  
 creatures admirably apply this principle in  
 making their underground tunnel cities.  
 The burrows have two openings—one at  
 ground level, the other located on a  
 foot-tall chimney of mud and stones.  
 They work hard to make that second  
 opening higher than the flat one on  
 ground level.  
 Having done this, the  
 Bernoullie principle takes effect and nicely  
 aerates their burrows with fresh air.

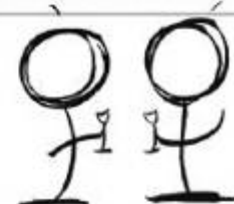

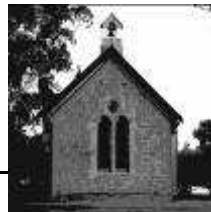

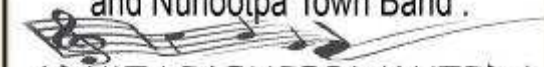
